


During the 2018 Swim season, it will be mandatory for all patrons utilizing the Aquatic Park on a daily fee basis to prove they are an Alsip resident with a Drivers License or a report card with an address on it. All children coming into the pool without a parent will be required to prove residency with a report card with an Alsip address on it. **Any children 11 years of age and younger must be accompanied by a parent or responsible person 16 years of age or older at all times.**

Splash Pad

The Alsip Aquatic Park's Safari theme splash pad opened in July 2014. The splash pad covers 2,145 square feet of wet play area. This area has many different types of water features including dumping coconuts, a barrel and swaying palm trees along with bubbling geysers and 3 character water cannons and much more. In addition, new shade structures have been added through out the facility and additional lounge chairs have also been added. Extended hours will be available during the month of September (weather permitting) for a daily admission fee to the splash pad area. We have also added two new slides on deck, zero depth entry into the existing wading pool and ADA compliant steps to enter the large swimming pool. 

General Membership Information

- 1. All season pass registrations will take place at Apollo Recreation Center during regular office hours. Proof of residency will be required! Adults 18 years of age and older will need a minimum of 2 pieces of identification (1 must be a picture I.D. with an Alsip address and the other must be a current utility bill). This includes people renewing membership as well.
- 2. All season pass members must have a photo I.D. card made at the Apollo Recreation Center.
- 3. Bring your 2017 pool pass or activity card when registering.
- 4. Family memberships are based on 4 people. Family memberships can include a Grandparent and babysitter as the adult in the family pass package.
- 5. A family membership will be sold to two adults and any children living in the same household under the age of 22 that are full-time students. Only immediate family members are allowed to be included in the family membership. The student will be required to show a current school I.D.

Mastering swimming skills takes time, practice, and patience. It is not unusual for students to repeat a level several times in order to master the skills required for a completion certification and advancement to the next level.

The programs are designed to meet the individual recreation needs of any person who is in special education classes, participates in a sheltered workshop, is referred to SWSRA from a local hospital or rehabilitation center, or who's special needs restrict or prohibit their participation in traditional park district setting. This would include individuals who have varying degrees of physical or mental disabilities, learning disabilities, behavior disorders, attention deficit disorders, hearing or visual impairments.

SWSRA's Sensory Depot

SWSRA opened a Sensory Room in January 2017 that provides children and adults with disabilities we serve with a multi-sensory environment that promotes neurological activity and encourages relaxation, allowing participants to experience their senses and soothe themselves. Multi-sensory environments promote development, learning, and communication and lead to improved quality of life. Time spent in a multi-sensory environment has been shown to increase concentration; to focus attention; to improve alertness, mobility, creativity, social relations, communications, and general awareness of the surrounding world; and to encourage learning, motor development, cognitive development, language, and social interaction skills. Our Sensory Room will be available to individuals of all ages and all abilities. However, the Sensory Room will be particularly beneficial for individuals with autism spectrum disorders, sensory processing disorders, ADHD, and dementia.



SWSRA's Sensory Room will consist of equipment that provides sensory stimulation opportunities. The following sensory stimulation elements are examples that will be part of our Sensory Room:

- **Bubble Tube:** Bubble tubes allow clients to seek visual stimulation with the coloring changing light and the calming effect of the bubbled water.
- Side Sparkle Kit: 78" length tendrils allow participants to play in a safe way with light and explore tactile stimulation with the tendrils in a ground stimulation activity. This item is especially ideal for clients who utilize wheelchairs as the "mat relaxation time" allows muscles to be stretched as stimulus to other body parts are provided by the tendrils and rotating color lights.
- Activity Play Panel Center: Panels feature a variety of fine motor options for clients. The Activity Play Panel Center includes velcro, see-thru mesh, transparent vinyl, and art display panels.

- **POD Pillows:** Allows relaxation of the body in a comfortable pillow-seat that has a higher elevation of support for clients with less muscle control.
- Octagon Rest Zone: Series of interconnected mats that provide rim support for clients to allow group social relaxation time or support for individuals with limited muscle tone.

Parents, guardians, and staff are welcome to stay in the program room while the participant uses the sensory room supervised by SWSRA staff. Sessions are 30 minutes each and you may drop in at any time during the allotted reservation time, however the last session must arrive 30 minutes prior to the end time. SWSRA staff close the room at each designated end time without exceptions. Registration is required through the SWSRA office located at 12521 S. Kostner Ave., Alsip IL. Payments will not be accepted at the Sensory Depot. The Sensory Depot is located at 10707 S. Oak Park Ave., Worth IL. The doors will remain locked to the building until 5 minutes prior to the session beginning.



Residency

Proof of residency in the form of a picture I.D. and current tax bill or utility bill may be required during program registration. Alsip Park District residents are given first priority for program registration.

Program Limitations

Each program at the Alsip Park District has an established minimum and maximum number of possible registrants. These numbers are set to guarantee the highest quality program we can offer. The facility, student/teacher ratio and the nature of the program considered when setting program registration minimums and maximums. The minimum size of trees shall be two inches in caliper. For purchasing a tree, a donor will have the opportunity to assist the park district in selecting the site where the tree will be planted and you will receive a letter acknowledging the donation.


